 It combines the rich features of Blackboard and other E-Learning packages.


It is easily installed, and is user friendly.

- Students can "chat" in a monitored safe environment.



Dress Codes at OLPH

At OLPH, the summer dress code is the same for boys and girls: navy walking shorts and a white polo with the OLPH logo and a belt. During the winter, middle school girls wear a plaid navy and white skirt and may wear a short sleeve exford shirt or a turtleneck (both with the OLPH logo). Boys wear a long sleeved exford shirt with a gray and navy/black striped tie and navy dress pants. For P.E., we wear mesh shorts with the OLPH logo and a polo or spiritwear shirt with the OLPH logo for summer and for winter we wear navy sweatpants and a navy sweatshirt (with the OLPH logo) over the summer P.E. uniform.

The pros to our uniforms are that they limit competition, unify the student body (hence the name <u>uniform</u>), and you almost never have to pick out an outfit in the morning.

The cons to our uniform are that they are not interesting, limit our self expression, and I agree with everyone else that the girls' winter uniform (sweater or no sweater) is not warm enough.


